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## Pope Francis' recent support for Lord's Prayer changing the wording "lead us not into temptation."

The church has a long history of fiddling with the Lord's Prayer and debating the right wording. Scripture itself isn't unified on the wording. The Bible gives us two versions of the prayer—often referred to as the Our Father—one from Matthew's gospel (Matt. 6:9–13) and one from Luke's gospel (Luke 11:2–4).

Additionally, today we often forget that the last two lines ("for thine is the kingdom...") aren't from Scripture but were added later by well-intentioned churchmen who felt that ending with sin didn't tell the whole story. Then there's the question of translations and traditions. If Matthew's wording probably borrows a term that refers to financial debts in the original Greek, is it okay that many traditions say "trespasses"?

Pope Francis recently waded into the wording of the Lord's Prayer by supporting a decision by the French Catholic church to change the wording of a line in the French translation of the prayer.

In an interview last week, Francis agreed that the new wording adopted by the French Catholic church was theologically clearer, suggesting that the previous version was not a "good translation."

The phrase, "Ne nous soumets pas

à la tentation" (roughly "Don't subject us to temptation") was updated this Sunday to be "Ne nous laisse pas entrer en tentation" (meaning "Don't let us go into temptation.") In English, the phrase is traditionally rendered "lead us not into temptation." The concern for the French church and the pope is that the wording may suggest that God causes people to sin.

"It's not about letting me fall into temptation. It's I, the one who falls, not Him pushing me toward temptation, so as to then see how I fall," Francis said, in an Italian interview with TV2000, a television channel owned by Italy's conference of bishops. "No, well, a father won't do that. A father will immediately help you pick yourself up. Satan's the one leading you into temptation. That's Satan's task."

The Lord's Prayer is a deeply loved and familiar invocation memorized and recited by millions of Christians around the globe every week. The Roman Catholic Church considers it a brief paraphrase of the whole gospel, and for centuries theologians of various traditions have insisted that the way the church prays indicates what the church believes ("Lex Orandi, Lex Credendi"). So, it's important to get the wording right.

# French Police Faked Records in Cover-Up After ISIS Jihadists Killed Priest in Church

French intelligence agents allegedly changed the date in a document in an attempt to remove evidence about their blunders that allowed Islamic State supporters to kill French priest Rev. Jacques Hamel inside his parish in 2016.

French prosecutors have opened a criminal inquiry into the allegation that the agents postdated a document as a cover-up, according to The Times, which quoted French news website Médiapart

as saying the agents were more concerned about their careers than tracing terrorists.

The inquiry will be conducted by the "police of the police," Inspection Generale de la Police Nationale, according to Sputnik News, which also said a lawyer representing some of the attack survivors has reportedly asked to declassify all the documents related to the case.

On July 26, 2016, Islamic State jihadists Adel Kermiche and Abdel-Malik Petitjean stormed the church in Saint-Étienne-du-Rouvray in Normandy and slit the throat of the 85-year-old priest. The two were shot dead by police as they left.

Five days before the killing, an agent from the Paris Police Prefecture Intelligence Unit

stumbled upon a message in the encrypted channel Telegram in which someone boasted that "I haven't been uncovered."

The sender of the message, with the username @Jayyed, was later identified as Kermiche, who



also posted a video on the channel saying he had given lessons in a mosque in the town in Normandy advising his followers to "go into a church and take out everyone."

The agent informed senior officials about Kermiche, advising they inform the General Direction of Interior Security, the French chief intelligence agency. This information was not sent. After the church incident, the agent was asked to post-date his notes and erase the browser history on his computer. However, the document with the original date on it wasn't deleted from one of the computer files. The slaving of the priest shook all of France, including many in the Muslim community.

### Democrat Doug Jones Wins Alabama. Senate Race; Roy Moore Says 'God Is in Control'



Democrat Doug Jones won a bitter fight for a U.S. Senate seat in deeply conservative Alabama on Tuesday, dealing a political blow to President Donald Trump in a race marked by sexual misconduct accusations against Republican candidate Roy Moore.

The stunning upset makes Jones the first Democrat elected to the U.S. Senate from Alabama in a quarter-century and will trim the Republicans' already narrow Senate majority to 51-49, opening the door for Democrats to possibly retake the chamber in next year's congressional elections.

U.S. stock futures, Treasury yields and the dollar dipped on Wednesday on the news of Jones' victory which could endanger Trump's policy agenda. With 99 percent of the vote counted, Jones had a lead of 1.5 percentage points over Moore. But the Republican refused to concede, telling supporters in Montgomery that votes were still coming in and state law would trigger a recount if the margin was within half a percent."Realize that when the vote is this close that it's not over," Moore said. "We also know that God is always in con-

Moore, 70, a Christian conservative twice removed from the state Supreme Court in Alabama for ignoring federal law, denied the allegations and said he did not know

any of the women who made them. Reuters has not independently verified them

Trump endorsed Moore even as other party leaders in Washington walked away from him, but Jones, 63, a former federal prosecutor, portrayed the campaign as a referendum on decency and promised the state's voters he would not embarrass them in Washington."I have always believed that the people of Alabama have more in common than divides us," Jones told cheering supporters at his Birmingham victory party, where Lynyrd Skynyrd's "Sweet Home Alabama" had blasted from loudspeakers earlier."We have shown the country the way we can be unified," said Jones, who as a U.S. attorney prosecuted members of the Ku Klux Klan for the 1963 bombing of a Birmingham church that killed four little girls. Jones, who cast himself on the campaign trail as the candidate who could reach across the aisle and get things done in Washington, said Alabama had often taken the wrong road when it came to a crossroads."Tonight you took the right road," Jones said.

Jones is expected to take office early in January, after the results are certified. His election will not affect the pending votes in Congress on a tax overhaul or government funding.



### Pastor Mark Burns saved U.S. President Donald Trump From Poisonous Spider Bite in Oval Office

Pastor Mark Burns of Harvest Praise and Worship Center in Easley, South Carolina, says he saved U.S. President Donald Trump from a poisonous spider bite when he was in the Oval Office earlier this week.when he and a group of evangelical leaders presented Trump with the "Friends of Zion" Award for his decision last week to recognize Jerusalem as the capital of Israel.

The pastor, who has been a strong supporter of the president, explained that he was at the Oval Office to present Trump with the award for "his courageousness," when in his peripheral vision he saw a movement going up Trump's back.

"It was this massive, huge white spider. And it was darting toward the back of his neck," Burns recalled.

He thought to himself, "can anyone else see this?"

He noted that nobody else seemed to react, and it was happening so fast that his first instinct was "kill the spider, protect Trump."

Burns said that he smacked the president's back, killing the spider in the process — not an easy thing for him to do, given his fear of spiders.

"I cannot stand spiders, I have always had a fear of spiders, but because it was the president of the Untied Sates of America, and I saw it running literally toward his neck," he felt that he had to act.

Later on in the video the pastor said that it was a yellow sac spider that he killed, which according to the website VenomousSpiders.net, is poisonous. The website clarifies that the spider's bite "has mild and local cytotoxic and neurotoxic effects," though no fatal incident has ever been recorded.

Still, the bite is "quite painful from the outset. A person usually develops redness, swelling, and itching near the site of the bite. Redness disappears after about 72 hours, and the skin heals in a week or two."

Burns said that Trump is a "man's man" and that he wasn't startled by the pastor smacking him on the back, even though the room went quiet with people wondering what had happened.

The South Carolina preacher then turned to Secret Service agents and said, "please don't shoot me." When Trump asked whether the spider was dead, he presented the dead arachnid in his hand as evidence."I was not going to let this spider bite the president of the United Sates," he said.

He explained the sitaution and said, "I saved you Mr. President," joking that he "deserves a medal" for his actions. He said that everyone present laughed at the incident.Monday's Oval Office meeting included several big name Christian leaders, including Family Research Council's Tony Perkins, James Dobson of Family Talk Radio, televangelist Paula White, Dallas Pastor Robert Jeffress, African-American Pastor Harry Jackson, and former Southern Baptist Convention President Jack Graham, among others.Dobson called it an "incredible meeting" where the evangelical leaders prayed for Trump.

"There is a great deal of love between these evangelical leaders and the congregations that they represent, and I think the president in return," he said.

According to the traditional belief of the St.Thomas Christians in Kerala, the Hindu temples are ancient than the Christian churches. This tradition is totally in contradiction to the modern secular historical findings. During the period of the formation of the oral or written St. Thomas tradition, the historiography was not at all developed as of today. So the Malankara church historians have been just following the oral tradition of their predecessors without any question.

#### St. Thomas Tradition

According to this tradition, Apostle St. Thomas came to



Malankara by A D 52 at Kodungallor (Muziris) and converted 4 Hindu Brahmins families to Christianity. The miracle which he had performed in the temple pool water caused the Brahmins to believe in Jesus and they embraced Christianity and also he did put the cross at the top of the Hindu temple and reformed it as church. Afterwards in his ministry, Apostle Thomas

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established seven and a half churches in Malankara. This

> tradition is being handed down through the centuries.

#### The Arrival of Brahmins in Kerala

The period of arrival of the Brahmins in Kerala is still an endless dispute.

According to MGS Narayanan, a secular Indian historian, 34 Brahmin families landed in Kerala by 9<sup>th</sup> century AD. But professor ElamkulamKunjan Pillai, late Indian secular historian, gives an account of their entrance little earlier as 5<sup>th</sup> century. During these centuries, most probably, Brahmins had a nomadic way of living, which means they have been a wandering people. As MGS Narayanan says, they got

settled as families only by 9<sup>th</sup> century. P K Sreenivasan and KN Sivarajapillai have noted that the Brahminical stories did not spread in south India where Thirukkural was the holy book. Thirukkural does not mention about Brahmins

This is a short meditation based on Luke 15:11-13.

Luke 15:11-13 -11 Then He said: "A certain man had two sons. 12 And the younger of them said to his father, 'Father, give me the portion of goods that falls to me.' So he divided to them his livelihood. 13 And not many days after, the younger son gathered all together, journeyed to a far country, and there wasted his possessions with prodigal living.

I would like to compare the "Far country" to the World. Some of us were in that "far country" before we were saved. Some of you are in the church, but you wonder what is going on out in the "far country". Let me tell you that there is nothing out there for you. Sooner or later some of you will consider-even if just a passing thought—about the "far country."



In his famous work on Kerala history, Samskaram, mentioned about a traveler who made voyages to Kerala during century.Cosmas Indicopleustes, meaning "Cosmas who sailed to India"; also known as Cosmas the Monk, was a Greek merchant and later hermit from Alexandria of Egypt. His work **Christian Topography** contained some of the earliest and most famous world maps. He described and sketched some of what he saw in his Topography. In 522 AD, he visited the Malabar Coast (South India). He is the first traveler to mention Christians in present-day Kerala in India.He wrote, "In the island of Tabropane (Ceylon), there is a church of Christians, and clerks and faithful. Likewise, at Male where the pepper grows; and in the town of Kalliana there is also a bishop concentrated in Persia".Mr. Menon cites this as an evidence to the existence of the Christian churches in Kerala prior to any Hindu Temple. There is no doubt that this ancient secular historical record about a Christian church is two centuries before the existence of a Hindu temple.

Philadelphia Eagles quarterback Carson Wentz's NFL season came to an end with an ACL injury Sunday, but that isn't stopping him from trusting that God has a perfect plan. Wentz, 24, found a reason to celebrate his team and God despite tearing his ACL in the Eagles' 43-35 win against the Los Angeles Rams Sunday. That win helped clinch the Eagles' 2017 NFC East championship. Even though Wentz's injury has officially ended his season, he took to Twitter to support

"NFC East Champs! So proud of the resiliency of this team," "Such a special group of men. And I greatly appreciate all the prayers!"Wentz

He also shared a scripture and his mindset after a brutal injury." I know my God is a powerful one with a perfect plan," he wrote. "Time to just lean in to Him and trust whatever the circumstances! #Proverbs3:5-6."

This season, a number of Eagles have been vocal about taking part in multiple Bible studies throughout the week. Last month, Eagles tight end Trey Burton blamed Satan for his teammates getting injured after they focused on God.

"We've had a lot of guys who are strong leaders get hurt after showing their boldness for the Lord," Burton said in a CBS Sports report. "Satan can't control us on the field, so he's going to try to attack us off the field, attacking us physically." Earlier this year, Wentz opened up about his faith at a live event that took place at Eastern University in Pennsylvania. While there, he explained the concept of God's grace and how it separates Christianity from other religions in the world.




there to restrict us but to protect us. Rules are not like a prison from which you should want escape, but a heaven of protection from outside.

Creation Festival Founder Arrested for Alleged Child Molestation



Harry L. Thomas, founder of the Creation Festival and senior pastor of Come Alive New Testament Church in Medford, New Jersey, has been accused of sexually assaulting four children over a 16-year period between 1999 and 2015. The church stated that the alleged misconduct was "unrelated" to his leadership.

Thomas, 74, has been charged with one count of aggravated sexual assault, three counts of sexual assault, and four counts of endangering the welfare of children, according to the prosecutor's office in Burlington County, New Jersey, where Thomas lives and where his church is located. Authorities have refrained from releasing further details in order to protect the identity of the victims.

"All persons are considered innocent until proven guilty in a court of law," stated the prosecutor's office. It noted that Thomas was "being treated at a medical facility" while a case was prepared for "possible indictment" by a grand jury.

"It is with deep regret and saddened hearts that the Elders and Trustees of Come Alive New Testament Church have indefinitely suspended Pastor Harry Thomas from all leadership positions with the church, festival, and all associated ministries," the ministry said in a statement to media Thursday.

"While the allegations are unrelated to his roles in these ministries, leadership has determined this to be the proper course of action at this time until there can be a full investigation," stated church leaders. "It is requested that all pray for the parties involved and refrain from speculation regarding the circumstances."

## Israel Discovers Covert Iranian Intelligence Operation Near Hebron

Israel's Shin Bet security agency said Tuesday that it has uncovered an Iranian military intelligence operation near Hebron that was planning to carry out terror attacks and collect intelligence for the Islamic Republic

According to the Shin Bet, the key suspect arrested was Mahmoud Makharmeh, 29, a computer engineering student who resides in Hebron. He was recruited for Iranian intelligence by his relative, Bakhar Makharmeh, who is also from Hebron but has

resided in South Africa in recent years.

In 2015, Mahmoud Makharmeh visited South Africa and met several times with Iranian intelligence agents, the Shin Bet said.

"The operation demonstrates the Iranian involvement in encouraging terror attacks against Israel and also shows the forces being sent by Iran to countries around the world, in order to advance enemy activities against Israel," stated the Israeli security agency.

# God in Flesh THE INCARNATION OF CHRIST

The study of christ begins with the incarnation. By incarnation we mean the birth of jesus as the son of mary. It is incarnation becauseit was the not begining of his life, He was pre-existent. Human birth is the orgin of the individual person, Whereas Jesus as a person who was exiting from eternity. It does not resemble the Hindu concept of re-incarnation or transmigration. That is the idea of human souls begin born again in other body after death according to their karma. The birth of Jesus is not such a result of karma.

Incarnation is a mystry, the work of the infinite God, that a finite man cannot understand or explain. In human understanding it is a miracle. mary begin a virgin asked how this take place, when angel Gabriel announced it (luke 1:35) she wanted an explanation but the angel said "the holy spirit come up on you, and the power of the highest will overshadow you; therfore, also, that holy one who is to be born will be called the son of God". Mary was satisfied with the answer and accepted the incarnation saying "be it unto me according to the word"(luke 1:38).We furnish no other explanation about the birth of Jesus Christ. We just have to accept the comment of the angel"nothing is impossible with God"

The sonship of christ

The sonship of christ is not because he was born or reproduced by the father but it speaksof his essential relationshipwith the father. The character of son or he is "the effulgence or fullness of God's glory and the very impression of his sobstance(Hebrew 1:3) The point to a distinctness in which one side of the duality (double) is a perfect, yet depended, reproduction of other. The sonship includes"upholding all things by the word of his power (Hebrew 1:3). While verse Hebrew 1:8 testify his deity. It desnots a relation which is essential and transendent. it is as son Christ discharges. His priestlyfunction sacrificing Himself in deth and resurrection, extering through His blood as priest with the veil. It is in the son that God has spoken (Hebrew 1:2) and as son that He intercedes (Hebrew 4:14, 7:28) indissociably bound up with the very though of sonship. Christ and God are of one divine nature, yet within this unity there obtain relations of higher and lower. Consecrated and send by the father (John 10:36). The sonship of Christ is not by reproduction.

The great mystery of the incarnation is the crux and the core of the Christian message. It is the mystery over which the rationalists stumble, by which the humanists are offended and by which the world is bewilderd. The natural mind is not equipped ti grasp this truth. The apostle paul said, "Without controversy great is the mystery of godliness; God was manifested in the flesh, justified in the spirt, seen by angels, preached among the gentiles, believed on in the world, receved up in glory" (1Timothy 3:6).

#### 07-...A SEEKING GOD ....

God is in full conciliation with the world and the nature with its creator. Then you have the shepherds who wondered. Wonder is the ultimate praise of worship. The wise men, the kings of this world bows to the king of Kings.God did give a lot of significance to the event of incarnation while Crucifixion and resurrection were achievement of finalproceedings and ascension had the least of celebration.

To say it another way, wrapped in the manger is the salvation of the world. The Cross, Resurrection, and Ascension are all present implicitly in the baby Jesus, only to be unpacked over the next thirty-plus years. Far from being secondary, the Incarnation is in very real sense our saving moment!

Simeon says: "For my eyes have seen your salvation" (Luke 2:30).

We miss this because we are looking backward through the Cross to the crib. But, even before Adam fell, God was looking "forward" through the crib to the Cross!

It is in the Pastoral Epistles—1 and 2 Timothy and Titus—that we find most profoundly this idea that salvation comes in the person of Jesus Christ. In a resounding echo of the angels' chorus, Paul rings in, twice asserting that he has been "appointed a herald" of the Good News (1 Tim. 2:7; 2 Tim. 1:11). Paul is sure that the day of God's kingdom has dawned with the birth of the King. The focus is the arrival or appearance of Christ, not his works:

The grace of God has appeared, bringing salvation to all. (Titus 2:11 NRSV)

When the kindness and love of God our Saviour appeared, he saved us. (Titus 3:4–5a)

Simply put, with the arrival of the Saviour, the world is saved.

"God our Saviour" is an Old Testament depiction. For this scarlet thread in the Pastorals we need look no further than the first sentence of 1 Timothy: "Paul, an apostle of Christ Jesus by the command of God our Saviour and of Christ Jesus our hope."

[God] has saved us and called us to a holy life—not because of anything we have done but because of his own purpose and grace. This grace was given us in Christ Jesus before the beginning of time, but it has now been revealed through the appearing of our Saviour, Christ Jesus, who has destroyed death and has brought life and immortality to light through the gospel. (2 Tim. 1:9–10)

The phrase "revealed through the appearing" is a significant indicator for us, because it insists that "Saviour" is who God is. Jesus Christ did not suddenly become Saviour when he died for our sins; he was born, lived, died, and rose again for us because he is Saviour!

Before Christ, humanity had no view directly into God's nature, and we were left to be awed by his transcendence. In Christ the invisible becomes visible, and he who cannot be seen has appeared; the unapproachable has drawn near! All religions and their scriptures seek God but the in the Bible God seeks mankind. It begins with:-

But the LORD God called out to the man (Adam), "Where are you?" (Gen 3:9)

And continues with:-

"Listen! I stand at the door and knock; if any hear my voice and open the door, I will come into their house and eat with them, and they will eat with me. (Rev 3:20).

God with us means- us with God.Open the door; so that you have a Merrier Christmas and a Happy New Year.
